

# Community Connect Grants

## What does this program do?

**This program provides financial assistance to eligible applicants that will provide high speed internet service in rural communities. The projects funded by these grants help rural residents tap into the enormous potential of the internet for jobs, education, healthcare, public safety and community development.**

## Who can apply for this program?

**Eligible applicants include:**

- **State and local governments**
- **Federally recognized Tribes**
- **Nonprofits**
- **For-profit corporations**
- **Limited liability companies**

### **What is an eligible area?**

Rural areas that lack internet speeds of 10 megabits per second (Mbps) downstream and 1Mbps upstream.

The Broadband Mapping Tool provides guidance on rural areas currently eligible for Community Connect Grants.

### **How can funds be used?**

Funds can be used for the construction, acquisition, or leasing of facilities, spectrum, land or buildings used to deploy broadband service for:

- All residential and business customers located within the Proposed Funded Service Area
- All participating essential community facilities (such as public schools, fire stations, public libraries, and public safety stations)

Funds may also be used to:

- Cover the cost of providing high-speed internet free of charge to essential community facilities for 2 years
- Up to 10 percent of the grant may be used for the improvement, expansion, construction, or acquisition of a community center that provides online access to the public

### **Are there other requirements?**

Other program requirements include:

- Documentation supporting the scoring criteria
- An executive summary of the proposed project
- Grantees must have legal authority to provide, construct, operate and maintain the proposed facilities or services
- Matching funds of at least 15 percent from non-federal sources are required and can be used for operating costs
- Partnerships with other federal, state, local, private, and nonprofit entities are encouraged
